## **Welcome to RDA Carine**

Volu	nteer Information
	RDA is an Equal Opportunity organisation and will consider all people offering to perform volunteer work for the organisation solely on the basis of their skill, aptitude and relevant qualifications. Volunteers between the ages of 14 years and 80 years must demonstrate that they are physically capable of performing the required duties they are allocated. Children under the age of 18 years must have parental permission to volunteer.
	<ul> <li>Volunteers over the age of 18 years are required under Western Australian legislation to undergo:</li> <li>Criminal history screening check via WA Police.</li> <li>Hold a current Working with Children Check card or able to apply for one.</li> <li>Our office staff will assist you with completing both checks.</li> </ul>
	RDA Carine respectfully recommends volunteers commit to a minimum of 12 months. Please ensure you have
	considered this when applying.  If your circumstances should change at any time, and you can no longer volunteer with RDA Carine, we appreciate your notification that you wish to withdraw and request that you return your volunteer shirt.
	Volunteers are here to assist with our riding programs and general horse care as instructed. Discussion in relation
	to our riders / clients are to remain confidential. Volunteers are not permitted to discuss a rider with carers / parents / guardians at any time.

	Times of arrival and departure must be signed in the Volunteer Attendance Register
	Volunteers are insured for personal accident
	RDA recommends that volunteers wear sun protective headwear, long sleeves, trousers and sunscreen whilst at RDA. Closed footwear is mandatory. Steel capped boots are NOT permitted to be worn due to the high risk. Thongs, high heeled shoes, flowing scarves, loose jewellery or hats that blow off should not be worn.
	RDA Carine also recommends volunteers stay up to date with Tetanus immunisations, COVID-19 and common flu vaccinations, boosters against Hepatitis B.

	Please disclose any changes to your medical status / circumstances that may prohibit you from performing your duties in safe manner.
	Safety is everyone's responsibility – report any concerns to the Coach or a Committee Member
	RDA is committed to providing a safe environment for all members. Volunteers are obligated to participate in Program Training appropriate to their allocated tasks and attend ongoing training days when requested.
